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## Cultural Activities:

The first event organized by the Students' Council was Maharashtra Day, called 'SAHYADRI'. The event was a mixture of folk songs, a skit on the life of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaja and also a Dhol-Tasha performance which featured 60-80 members of a local enthusiastic troop. On Day 2, a Bollywood themed event where everybody dressed up as their favourite Bollywood character and a small ramp walk was conducted, which was followed by some games like tambola, etc. On Day 3, a small cultural program was organized, where students danced to the tunes of Bappa, this was preceded by a treasure hunt competition, where clues were hidden all over campus and the students had formed groups and searched through the campus decoding the clues. On Day 4, the final day of the event the final aarti was followed by Visarjan of the Ganesha idol and Mahaprasad in the boys hostel mess.

Annual social gathering, "UMANG 2023" took place in the New Auditorium on 5th and 6th of April. We witnessed a cultural event like never before. The entire program was a beautiful blend of various cultures, values and interests that the students hold. The performances ranged from various classical numbers like the enactment of

### **Regular NSS Activities:**

#### **Blood Donation:**
