REPORT

This training was conducted in an online- offline pattern where the trainers gave the training from Mumbai in an online manner but the training was conducted at Department of Community Medicine, MGIMS and facilitated by the IECD project staff. 40 ICDS supervisors of the entire Wardha district attended the 2 days training. They were sensitized about the importance of ECD and the need to start as early as possible. The brain wiring game was played with all the participants which in our experience gives a powerful message about the protective and risk factors for brain development. Most importantly what factors are

supportive to child development in the early 0 -3 years of a child's life and how to practice the same was discussed with the help of play activities and games.

Next session mainly focused on Responsiveness in child development and its positive impact. responsive caregiving as well as responsive feeding were discussed. Responsiveness was discussed as a part of the nurturing care framework and further the other components of the nurturing care framework were also discussed which help in holistic development of children.

Day 2 started with the Jamaican study of Early Childhood Development which further helped the participants understand the science behind the importance of early intervention and the effect of different kinds of intervention.

Further Dr. Abhishek Raut, Dr. Subodh S Gupta and Dr. Pranali gave a short introduction to the Inclusive ECD project and its goals. They spoke about monitoring of Child development which is equally important as growth monitoring and discussed a tool for monitoring child development in the 0 - 42 months age group - International Guide for Monitoring Child Development (iGMCD). This tool would be used in the Inclusive ECD project by the AWWs for monitoring development of children. The session concluded with valuable feedback from the participants.
